

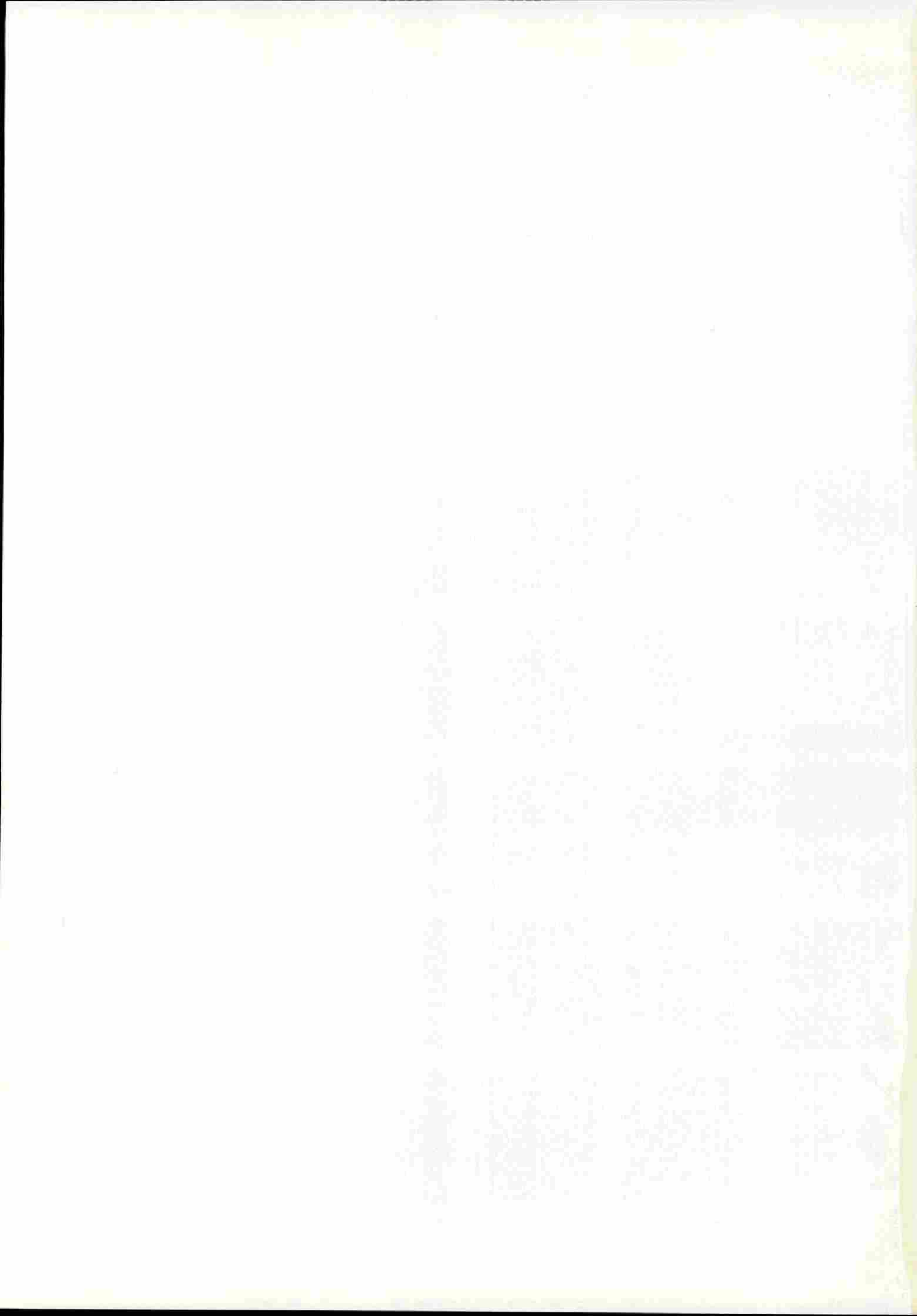

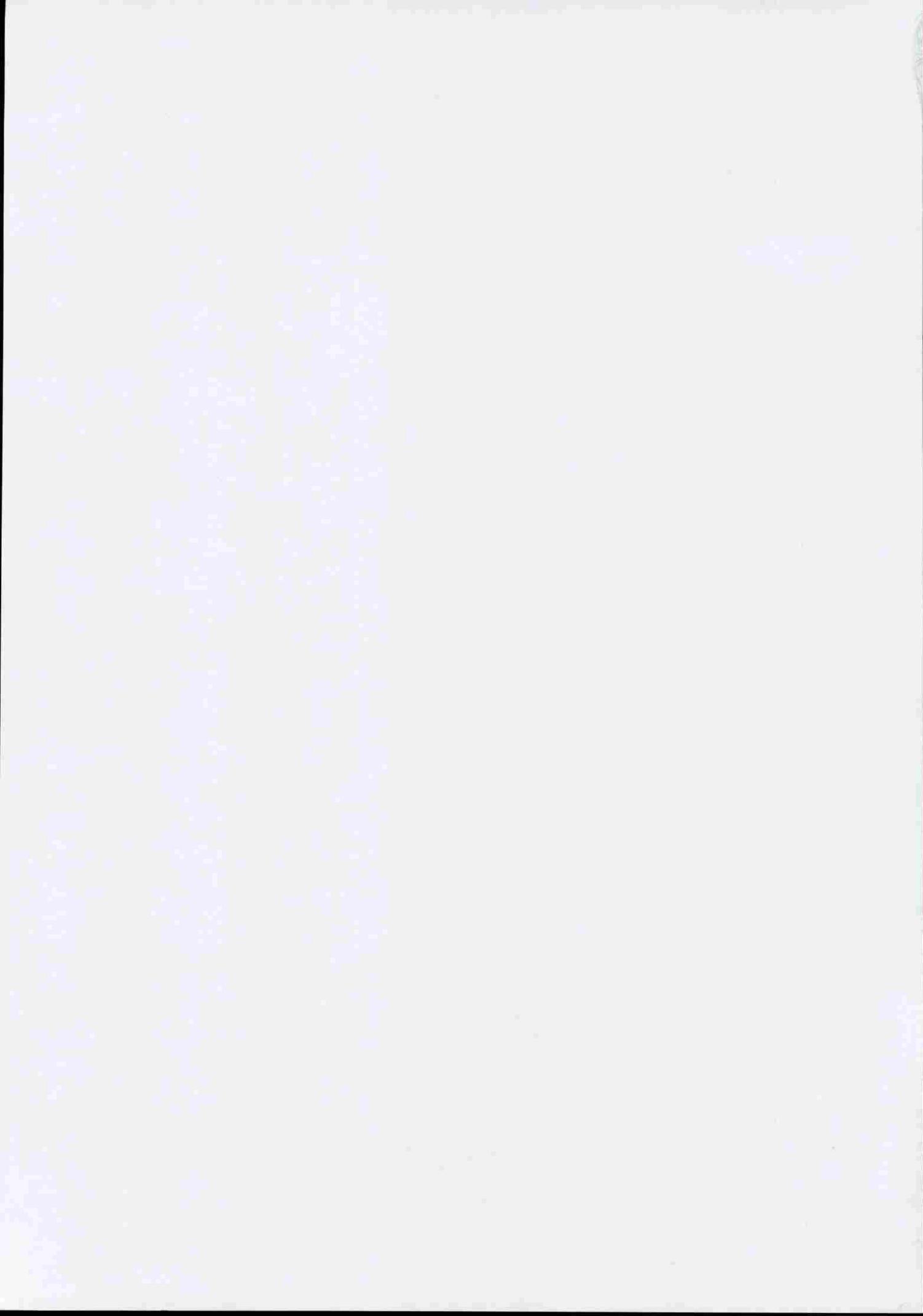

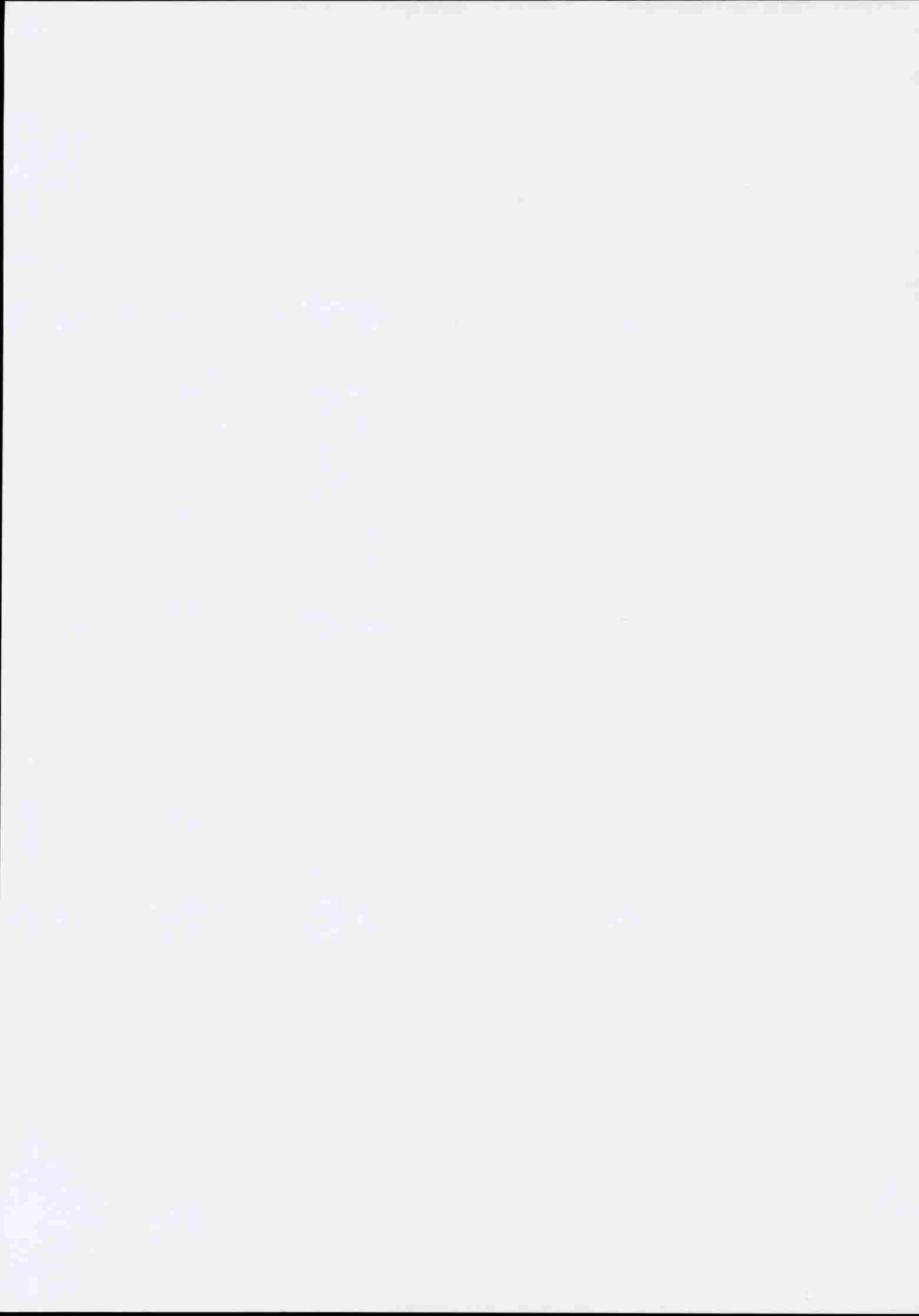

Annual Report of the Public Service Commission West Bengal

For the year 2012-2013

(1st April '2012 to 31st March '2013)

PART I

GENERAL

As a body enshrined in the Constitution of India, the Public Service Commission, West Bengal, has sincerely remained active in discharging its constitutional duties and living up to its tradition as inherited from the Bengal Public Service Commission that was formed under the Government of India Act, 1935 and which started functioning with effect from April, 1937. A report on its working during the year 2012-2013 is set-forth hereunder.

1. The Commission and its composition

3. Receipts and Expenditure

4. Functions of the Commission

The Constitution of India has enjoined consultation with the Public Service Commission on matters of appointment and certain other matters as specified in Article 320 in respect of the Civil Services and posts. The Public Service Commission has to perform the duties relating to matters specified in that Article. These include conducting examinations for appointment to Civil Services and posts under the State Government and advising the State Government on all matters relating to methods of recruitment to Civil Services and posts, on the principles to be followed in making appointments to Civil Services and posts and in making promotions and transfers from one service to another, on the suitability of candidates for such appointments, promotions or transfers and on all disciplinary matters affecting a person serving under the State Government in a civil capacity and on certain other matters.

Article 229 and Article 234 also contain provisions in terms of which the Commission is required to be consulted in matters of appointment to certain categories of posts in offices attached to the High Court and to the State Judicial Service respectively. Besides, Acts made for certain statutory bodies contain provisions for consultation with the Commission in matters of appointment to certain categories of posts under such bodies. Article 321 also contains provision in terms of which additional functions may be entrusted to the Commission by an Act made by the State Legislature as respects the services of the State or any local authority or any body corporate or any public institution. Such an Act has, however, not been made till now.

The Commission is consulted by the State Government in making recruitment to a majority of Civil Services and posts. However, some posts under the State Government have been kept outside the purview of the Commission by making regulations in terms of the proviso to Article 320(3) of the Constitution. Such regulations are the West Bengal Public Service Commission (Exemption from Consultation) Regulations, 2008.

5. Workload of the Commission

A statistical account of the main items of work performed by the Commission during the year 2012-2013 is given in the following pages under the caption: **Workload at a Glance.**

During the period under report, the Commission held 533 sittings to interview and select candidates for direct recruitment to various services and posts. Altogether 5,197 candidates were called in for interviews. The Commission continued its practice of inviting experts of different disciplines to assist it in the matter of selection of candidates and thus it maintained liaison with various universities, institutions and organizations.

For direct recruitment by competitive examination with or without interview, the Commission held 7 (seven) different kinds of recruitment examinations including W.B. Judicial Service (Preliminary) Examination, 2012, W. B. Audit & Accounts Service Examination (Preliminary), 2011, W.B. Judicial Service (Final) Examination, 2012, Krishi Proyukti Sahayak Recruitment Examination, 2011, Miscellaneous Services Recruitment (Final) Examination, 2011, W. B. C. S. (Exe) etc. (Main) Examination, 2012, W.B. Audit & Accounts Service Examination (Main), 2011. There were altogether 4,93,030 candidates for these examinations including 8,126 candidates admitted to the 04(four) Main Examinations. During the year under report, the Commission allotted, 1,209 candidates including 260 Scheduled Caste, 84 Scheduled Tribe and 118 (B.C. 'A'-8, B.C. 'B'-110) Backward Class candidates for appointment to different services and posts on the results of different recruitment examinations.

For direct recruitment through selection by interview (with or without preliminary written test) the Commission advertised 1351 posts of different categories and received altogether 1,25,463 applications. Preliminary written tests were held for 58 categories of posts for the purpose of short-listing of candidates. After selection, during the period under report, the Commission recommended 937 candidates including 246 S.C., 53 S.T., 112 B.C. and 13 P.H. candidates for appointment to different services and posts. The Commission also recommended another 2 candidates including 01 S.C. candidate for appointment to different services and posts from the reserve lists prepared on earlier selections.

For promotion, the Commission held 118 sittings to discuss the cases with the representatives of the concerned departments of the State Government. Altogether, 982 vacancies in different services and posts were reported to the Commission for being filled up by promotion. During the period under report, the Commission recommended 965 officers for promotion after considering cases of 3,931 officers and could not make any recommendation against 17 vacancies for various reasons.

In disciplinary matters, during the period under report, the Government forwarded 94 cases (41 fresh and 53 old) to the Commission for advice. The Commission was able to tender its advice only in 37 cases, while the remaining 53 cases were sent back to the Government asking for necessary papers/particulars and 4 cases were pending with the Commission till the closing of the year (i.e. 31.03.2013).

The Commission also tendered advice on framing of recruitment rules for 39 different categories of services and posts and on 03 cases regarding revision of examination rules.

During the year under report, the Commission held Half-yearly Departmental Examination in May and November, 2012 each time for 7 different categories of officers serving under the Government of West Bengal including those of I.A.S. probationers. The total number of registered candidates for the Departmental Examinations was 4,726.

Despite the fact that Commission performs its function according to the rules and regulations, the Commission was impleaded as a Respondent in a number of Court cases during the period under report. The cases were defended as per the rules and regulations as well as on the strength of records relating to the case. 78 fresh litigations, 24 in the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta and 54 in the Hon'ble West Bengal Administrative Tribunal were filed involving the Commission during the period under report, out of which 57 cases, 18 in the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta and 39 in the Hon'ble West Bengal Administrative Tribunal were contested by the Commission. Besides, 57 cases (including old pending cases), 3 in the Hon'ble Supreme Court, 38 in the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta, 14 in the Hon'ble West Bengal Administrative Tribunal and 2 in other courts against the Commission are pending. Apart from the aforesaid cases, 48 cases, 12 in Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta and 36 in Hon'ble West Bengal Administrative Tribunal were disposed of during the period under report.

Table I intra gives previous and current years' figures on certain items of work.

6. OBSERVATIONS

A. Requirement of consultation with the Commission regarding promotion:

The Commission has noticed that the proviso to Article 320(3)(b) is being interpreted by many Departments of the Government that consultation with the Commission is not necessary for making promotion from one post to another where the posts are (i) within the same service and (ii) not belonging to any service (i.e. the posts of West Bengal General Service). The Commission is of the view that such interpretation would not be in consonance with the spirit of the Constitution. The Patna High Court in the case of Hariprasad Vs. State (AIR-1972, Patna-4) and the Supreme Court in the case of Jammu and Kashmir Vs. Rajdulari Rajdan and others (AIR 1979-SC-586 and 587) gave the judgement in favour of consultation with the Commission in all cases of promotions. It is mentioned in this connection that the Union Public Service Commission after discussion on the point at the National Conference of the Chairmen of the State Public Service Commissions, has sought an amendment to Article 320(3)(b) in its memorandum to the National Commission set up to review the working of the Constitution so that the scope of interpreting the existing expression in the Article is obviated and the Commission is consulted in making promotions from one post to another.

The Commission expects that the State Government would consider the matter and take steps so that the Commission is consulted in making promotions from one post to another in all cases.

B. Reporting of vacancies to the Commission for various recruitment examinations:

The Commission has been experiencing difficulties in obtaining estimates of vacancies from the Departments of Government in time. In some cases much delay occurs in reporting vacancies to the Commission despite urgent requests and repeated reminders. Consequently, holding of personality tests after the written examinations in the concerned cases gets deferred and finalization of results of the examinations is delayed. Often vacancies are reported long after the completion of personality tests. Such vacancies cannot be accepted for that particular examination and remain to be filled up on the results of the next examination. Needless to mention that an estimate of vacancies is necessary for the Commission to fix up the number of candidates for the personality tests and once the personality test is completed on the basis of the estimated record, further vacancies for the particular examination cannot be accepted.

The Commission feels that it may be possible for the Departments of the Government to make a forecast of vacancies to occur in a year due to retirement. Additional vacancies due to resignations and/or creation of posts can also be accommodated mostly by the time the estimate of vacancies is required for the personality test. Such procedure should be followed in the cases of annual recruitment examinations in view of the difficulties mentioned above.

An annual calendar of vacancies in the posts within the purview of the annual recruitment examinations may be prepared and maintained by the appointing authority so that an estimate of vacancies in the posts for the annual recruitment examinations could be furnished positively by the 31st of March of the year of the examinations taking into account the vacancies to be available by the 31st of December of that year.

C. Disciplinary cases—Incomplete reference from Government Departments:

The Commission reiterates its earlier observation that the disciplinary cases are mostly referred to it for advice without furnishing necessary documents and particulars. Such cases are therefore required to be sent back to the Departments concerned and thus it is unnecessarily delayed.

D. Extension of Pre-examination Training Facilities:

The Commission in its earlier annual reports tendered advice in favour of the extension of the existing facilities of pre-examination training of SC/ST candidates for various recruitment examinations. It is noticed that a good number of vacancies reported for these categories of candidates remained unfilled for want of suitable candidates, even after sufficiently lowering the general standard, during the period under report. The Commission suggests that the Government may consider opening training centres in various places in the State, especially in the tribal concentrated districts.

E. Departmental Examinations—Ensuring Appearance of the officers at the Examinations:

It has come to the notice of the Commission that quite a large number of officers whose cases are forwarded to it and who are admitted to these examinations do not appear at the examinations, causing much inconvenience to the Commission as also wastage of time and drainage of money. So, the Commission suggests that the officers applying for the Departmental Examinations should be instructed by the Departments/Offices concerned to appear at the examinations without fail.

(i) No. of exams. held in two stages, viz. Preliminary and Main Examination :—

(a) No. of Preliminary Examinations : 2 (Two)

(during 2011-12 in 4 such examinations held with 2,86,875 applicants and 2,08,921 appeared).

(b) No. of Main Examinations : 4 (Four)

No. of candidates admitted : 8,126.

No. of candidates appeared : 5,599.

(ii) No. of Exams. held in one stage : 1 (One)

(without having any Preliminary or Main Examination)

No. of candidates applied : 4,80,865 (of whom 4,77,561 were provisionally allowed).

No. of candidates appeared : 3,13,643.

Limited Departmental Examination : 1 (One)

No. of candidates applied : 279.

No. of candidates admitted : 266.

No. of candidates appeared : 174.

[Details of all examinations are given in **Appendix I(A)**. Darjeeling was included as an Examination Centre for all the major recruitment examinations. 923 Candidates applied for the Darjeeling Centre of whom 861 were admitted and 535 took their examinations.]

Important particulars of the recruitment examinations held during the year 2012-2013 are as follows :—

(i) West Bengal Judicial Service (Preliminary) Examination, 2012 : Date of Examination—06.05.2012:

The examination was held at 3 venues in Kolkata and 1 venue in Darjeeling. In all 1,314 candidates applied for the examination of whom 1,145 candidates were admitted. 732 candidates took their examination.

(ii) West Bengal Audit and Accounts Service (Preliminary) Examination, 2011 : Date of Examination—09.06.2012:

The examination was held at 27 venues in Kolkata and 1 venue in Darjeeling. In all 10,851 candidates applied for the examination of whom 10,234 candidates were admitted. 6,169 candidates took their examination.

(iii) West Bengal Judicial Service (Final) Examination, 2012 : Dates of Examination—28.06.2012 to 07.07.2012 (except 02.07.2012 & 03.07.2012):

On the basis of the results of preliminary examination, 300 candidates were allowed to take the main examination held at the Examination Halls of P.S.C. of whom 282 candidates appeared.

- (iv) Krishi Proyukti Sahayak Recruitment Examination, 2011 : Dates of Examination–06.07.2012, 07.07.2012 & 08.07.2012:

The examination was held at 20 centres through out West Bengal in 6 separate batches (2 batches each for 3 days). In all 4,80,865 candidates applied of whom 4,77,561 candidates were allowed to sit for the examination. Finally, 3,13,643 candidates appeared at the examination. Number of venues at different centres were as follows:–

Kolkata–19, North 24-Parganas–19, South 24-Parganas–20, Howrah–8, Hooghly–14, Burdwan–28, Birbhum–10, Bankura–19, Purulia–9, Paschim Medinipur–14, Purba Medinipur–13, Nadia–23, Murshidabad–15, Malda–9, Uttar Dinajpur–10, Dakshin Dinajpur–5, Cooch Behar–16, Jalpaiguri–15, Siliguri–3, Darjeeling–1
(Total : 270 venues).

- (v) Miscellaneous Services Recruitment (Final) Examination, 2011 : Date of Examination–14.10.2012:

On the basis of the results of preliminary examination, 3,773 candidates were allowed to take the main examination held at 10 venues at Kolkata including the Examination Halls of P.S.C. of whom 2,520 candidates appeared.

- (vi) West Bengal Civil Service (Exe.) etc. (Main) Examination, 2012 : Dates of Examination–06.11.2012 to 21.11.2012 (except 10th, 13th, 15th & 17th November, 2012):

On the basis of the results of preliminary examination, 3,703 candidates were allowed to take the main examination held at 12 venues in Kolkata including the Commission's Examination Halls. 2,576 candidates appeared at the examination.

- (vii) West Bengal Audit and Accounts Service (Main) Examination, 2011 : Dates of Examination–12.03.2013 to 20.03.2013 (except 16th & 17th March, 2013):

On the basis of the results of the preliminary examination, 350 candidates were allowed to take the main examination held at Commission's Examination Halls of whom 221 candidates appeared.

Limited Departmental Examination

Limited Departmental Examination of eligible employees of the Govt. of West Bengal for promotion to the posts in the West Bengal Audit & Accounts Service, 2012: Dates of Examination–24.07.12 to 26.07.12.

The examination was held at the Commission's Examination Hall at Kolkata. 279 candidates applied for the examination of whom 266 candidates were admitted. 174 candidates appeared at the examination.

8. Departmental Examinations :

During the year under report, Half-yearly Departmental Examination was held in May and November of officers of 7 (seven) different categories serving under the Government of West Bengal. In May, 2012, number of officers registered for the examination was 2,350 of whom 1,001 officers appeared. In November, 2012, the number of registered candidates and appeared candidates were 2,376 and 1,302 respectively. In May and November, 2011, the position was as follows—In May, registered candidates = 2,739 & Present candidates = 1,257. In November, registered candidates = 2,650 & Present candidates = 1,383.

The particulars are given in detail in **Appendix–I (E).**

9. Adoption of unfair means by candidates in the examinations conducted by the commission :

During the year under report, 54 (fifty four) candidates were reported against by the Supervisors of different examination centres for adoption of unfair means in various examinations conducted by the Commission. The particulars of the cases showing the nature of offences and the penal measures taken against them are given in **Appendix–VIII.**

PART-III

DIRECT RECRUITMENT

10. Recruitment after advertisement and interviews:

During the year under report the Commission considered the proposals from Government reporting altogether 1393 posts of various categories for appointment, after advertisement and interviews for recommendation from the reserve lists. Details are given in Appendix-II (A) & Appendix-II (B) (synopsis) - 362 of the above posts were reserved for members of S.C., 134 for S.T., 172 for B.C. and 63 for P.H. candidates.

Regarding the 1393 posts, as above, the Commission took action as follows—

(a) 2 candidates including 1 SC candidate, recommended from its previous reserve lists.

(b) Advertised the remaining 1390 posts including 361 posts reserved for S.C., 133 for S.T., 172 for B.C. and 63 for P.H. candidates.

(c) 1 S.T. candidate could not be recommended from earlier reserve list as no. S.T. candidate was available in the reserve panel.

In response to the advertisements mentioned at (b) above 1,25,463 applications including 42151 from S.C., 4750 from S.T., 9640 from B.C. and 953 from P.H. candidates were received.

The number of candidates called in for interview during the year under report was 2825 including 772 S.C., 99 S.T., 367 B.C. and 24 P.H. candidates. Out of whom 2625 candidates including 713 S.C., 91 S.T., 351 B.C. and 24 P.H. candidates appeared at the interviews. The Commission held 251 sittings during the year under report for interviewing the candidates.

Out of 1351 posts advertised, the Commission recommended candidates for appointment to 937 posts including 513 for general candidates (11 S.C., 01 S.T. & 22 B.C. candidates ranked amongst the general candidates on merit were recommended against unreserved vacancies), 246 for S.C., 53 for S.T., 112 for B.C. & 13 for P.H. candidates. In respect of the remaining 414 posts including 107 reserved for S.C., 77 for S.T., 62 for B.C. and 49 for P.H. candidates, no candidate was available and hence the Commission could not make any recommendation. Of these posts 162 were teaching posts under Education Department and the remaining 253 posts were non-teaching posts requiring technical and/or professional qualifications.

In all, therefore, the Commission could recommend 939 candidates during the year under report including 247 posts reserved for S.C., 53 for S.T., 112 for B.C. & 13 for P.H. candidates—of which 2(1 UR & 1 SC) from its earlier reserve lists and 937 on the basis of advertisements issued by the Commission. During the year under report, Government dealt with the recommendations as follows :—

PART-IV : PROMOTION

The Commission made recommendation for filling up of 965 vacancies during the period. The Commission could not make any recommendation for filling up of remaining 17 vacancies for want of suitable officer or in some cases owing to non-availability of the relevant service records and information/A.C.Rs etc. The details may be seen in **Appendix - III.**

The Commission could not or did not recommend officers for promotion to 17 out of 982 vacancies reported to it for being filled by promotion during the year under report for reasons noted below :

During the year under report 231 vacancies reserved for Scheduled Caste and 72 vacancies reserved for Scheduled Tribe Officers were reported to the Commission for being filled by promotion.

The Commission considered the cases of 360 SC & 46 ST Officers for promotion. Of them, the Commission recommended 159 SC & 20 ST Officers against the said reserved vacancies. The Commission also recommended 10 SC & 2 ST Officers against unreserved vacancies. For the remaining reserved vacancies, there were dearth of adequate number of eligible/suitable officers belonging to the said communities as a result of which the Commission had no other alternative but to fill up the said vacancies by general candidates in accordance with the decision of the Departments concerned, as communicated to the Commission.

PART-V

(A) Statistics and Research :

During the year under report the Commission tendered advice on the following cases which were dealt with in its Statistics and Research Branch:

1. Framing of recruitment rules in respect of 39 different services and posts under Government, the details of which may be seen in **Appendix-IV A**.

PART-VI(B) Examination Reforms Cell :

1. During the year under report the Commission considered and tendered advice on 3 (Three) cases regarding revision of examination rules. Of them 1 (One) case was finalized by Government during the year under report. Details are given in **Appendix-IV B**.

All the 2 (Two) cases which were shown in the last year's report as pending are still pending till date.

2. The Commission took up the task of revision/re-structuring of the syllabus of all the optional papers for the West Bengal Civil Service (Executive) etc. Examination last year. In the first phase, during the last year the Commission re-structured the syllabi of 14 optional subjects out of 36 subjects. Likewise the Commission re-structured the syllabi of 15 optional subjects out of the remaining in this year which were also finalised and incorporated in the 'Information Brochure' for West Bengal Civil Service (Executive) etc. Examination, 2013.

PART-VII

Disciplinary Cases:

During the year under report 94 (ninety four) cases were referred to the Commission for advice of which 41 (forty one) cases were referred to the Commission for the first time and 53 (fifty three) cases which had been referred to the Commission earlier but returned for want of requisite documents and other particulars related to those cases. On verification 53 (fifty three) cases including some of the old cases were found wanting in relevant documents/particulars and were returned to Govt. 04 (four) were under examination of the Commission till the close of the year under report. The Commission in the process, could tender advice in 37 (thirty seven) cases during the year under report details of which are shown in **Appendix-V**. In 22 (twenty two) cases Govt. reported acceptance of the recommendation of the Commission. Regarding the remaining 15 (fifteen) the decision of the Govt. has not been communicated to the Commission till the close of the year under report.

In the last year's Annual Report 26 (twenty six) cases were shown pending with the Govt. for decision to be taken on the advice of the Commission. Subsequently, the Govt. intimated acceptance of the recommendation of the Commission in 18 (eighteen) cases but the decision of the Govt. regarding the remaining 8 (eight) cases has not been intimated till the close of the year under report.

There was no case where the Government overrode the recommendation of the Commission in regard to the appointment of candidates on the results of the various recruitment examination conducted by the Commission during the year under report.

PART-X

Recruitment Rules/Service Rules

During the year under report, the Commission has dealt with three (3) cases regarding revision of examination rules and has tendered its advice to the Government. The Government till the closing of the year has finalized one (1) case and the remaining two (2) cases are still pending with the Government vide **Appendix-IV-B**.

In short, during the year under report, the Govt. altogether finalized one (1) case of Revision of Examination Rules out of three (3) such cases on which the Commission had tendered its advice, i.e. nearly 33.33% of the total work.

Besides, the Commission, during the year under report, also tendered advice on framing of recruitment rules for thirty nine (39) different categories of services and posts from twenty five (25) different departments under the Government of West Bengal. In the previous year, corresponding figures were two hundred forty one (241) and twenty nine (29) respectively.

PART-XI

During the year under report total 543 (five hundred and forty three) cases were received by S.P.I.O., P.S.C., W.B. under R.T.I. Act, 2005 soliciting various information. Amongst these R.T.I. aspirants, 20 (twenty) made First Appeals to the Appellate Authority, P.S.C., W.B. as well. A good number of petitioners put forth multiple representations at times. The S.P.I.O. and Appellate Authority in the office of the P.S.C., W.B. responsibly accomplished the task of dispatching replies to all the information seekers within the time limit as specified under R.T.I. Act, 2005. It is worthwhile to mention that only 4 (four) R.T.I. cases were eventually referred by the information seekers to the West Bengal Information Commission for hearing which were duly attended by the R.T.I. officials of P.S.C., W.B. The judgements delivered by West Bengal Information Commission after those hearings were strictly adhered to by the S.P.I.O., P.S.C., W.B.

Acknowledgement

The Commission thankfully acknowledges the assistance received from prominent personalities in various fields, including officials of the Government of West Bengal and Government of India. The Commission places on record its appreciation and gratitude to them for their active co-operation and assistance.

The Commission would also place on record its deep appreciation for the staff and authorities of the educational institutions, examiners, invigilators, the staff and authorities of the printing works and all others who assisted in the smooth conduct of the Commission's business.

The Commission would also thankfully acknowledge the hard work, devotion and efficiency shown by the members of the staff of the Commission. The nature of its work is such that without loyal and dedicated service by its employees, the Commission will not be able to discharge its responsibilities.
