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Annual Report of the Public Service Commission West Bengal

BRIEF HISTORY

(1) The evolution of the Public Service Commission in India can be traced back to the persistent demands raised by the educated Indians for admission into the Indian Civil Service. The Montagu-Chelmsford report incorporated a provision regarding this demand of the Indian Youth and ultimately the Govt. of India Act, 1919 saved the path for the formation of the Public Service Commissions. Section 96C of the Govt. of India Act, 1919 provided for the establishment of a Public Service Commission in India to regulate the recruitment and control the public services in India and perform such functions as may be assigned thereto by Rules made by the Secretary of State in Council.

(2) The passing of the Govt. of India Act, 1919 was followed by a protracted correspondence stretching over four years between the Secretary of State, the Govt. of India and local Governments regarding the framework of the body to be constituted. Subsequently, the Lee Commission in its report dated 27th March, 1924, recommended the establishment of the Public Service Commission as suggested by the Government of India Act, 1919 without any further delay.

(3) Pursuant to the provisions of the Section 96(C) of the Govt. of India Act, 1919 and the recommendation of the Lee Commission, Central Public Service Commission was set up for the first time in India in October, 1926. It was formed in accordance with the traditions of the British Civil Service Commission. The functions of the Public Service Commission were regulated by the Public Service Commission (Functions) Rules, 1926 framed under Sub-Section (2) of Section 96(C) of the Government of India Act, 1919. These rules provided for consultation with the Commission in respect of recruitment to All India Services, Central Services Class I and Class II, on questions of drawing up of syllabi for examinations and of qualifications for recruitment by selection, on promotion to these services, on disciplinary cases, on questions connected with pay and allowances, pension, provident funds, leave rules and conditions of service.

(4) The next significant development in the history of Public Service Commission in India was the issuance of a White Paper in December, 1931 delineating proposals for Indian Constitutional Reforms. The White Paper also contained a blue print of the Public Service Commissions for the proposed Federation and the provinces. The report of the Joint Committee on Indian Constitutional Reforms (1934) further reiterated the need for setting up a federal PSC and a PSC for each province. The Govt. of India Act, 1935 envisaged a Public Service Commission for the federation and a Provincial Public Service Commission for each Province or Group of Provinces.

(5) In terms of the provisions of this Act and its coming into effect on 1st April, 1937, a Public Service Commission was formed in each province except in cases of certain provinces which formed the Joint Public Service Commissions. This is the background for the emergence of Bengal Public Service Commission in 1937 and its continuance as the PSC, West Bengal.

(6) The Constituent Assembly realized the importance of giving a secure and autonomous status to the Public Service Commissions both at Federal and Provincial levels for ensuring recruitment to Civil Services without any prejudiced and protection of service interests. With the promulgation of

the new Constitution for independent India on 26th January, 1950, Public Service Commissions in the States were accorded a Constitutional Status in terms of Article 315.

(7) After its formation, the PSC, W.B. started functioning from Bhabani Bhavan, Alipore. Subsequently, Examination Section of the office shifted to Town Hall, Kolkata while rest of the office operated from Bhabani Bhavan. After several years, the Town Hall was vacated and the Examination Section was accommodated in a building adjacent to Bhabani Bhavan. At that time, 2 floors of a building near Sealdah were used as examination venue. In the year 1989, the entire office of the PSC, W.B. was shifted to a newly constructed building at 161A, S.P. Mukherjee Road, Mudiali, Near Tollygunge Rly. Bridge. All the sections of the P.S.C., W.B. as well as exam. Venues are at present located in this building.

The Annual Report for the year ending on 31st March, 2017 has since been compiled. The core functions and the activities of the various sections of the Commission's Secretariat have been highlighted in the Annual Report. Data in respect of the examinations/selection procedures conducted, candidates recommended for employment, important information linked to the duties performed by the Commission have been incorporated to give an idea about the workload of the Commission during the period from 1st April, 2016 to 31st March, 2017.

The initiatives undertaken by the Commission to utilize the information and technology resources in its operations have started yielding results. The reduction in time interval between the publication of an advertisement and the declaration of results was achieved in case of major recruitment examinations/selection cases due to adoption of certain innovative measures and speedy implementation of e-governance in the last three years. The aim of the Commission is to develop the existing on-line set up and ultimately to conduct majority of the examinations on-line in order to limit the time gap in respect of publication of results to the bare minimum.

The Public Service Commission, West Bengal, endeavours to instill the highest level of efficiency in the discharge of its duties and responsibilities. The Commission would like to introduce more reforms and adopt new strategies in the coming years in keeping with the demands of the future generation.

PART I

GENERAL

As a body enshrined in the Constitution of India, the Public Service Commission, West Bengal, has sincerely remained active in discharging its constitutional duties and living up to its tradition as inherited from the Bengal Public Service Commission that was formed under the Government of India Act, 1935 and which started functioning with effect from April, 1937. A report on its working during the year 2016-2017 is set –forth hereunder.

3. Receipt and Expenditure

4. Functions of the Commission :

The Constitution of India has enjoined consultation with the Public Service Commission on matters of appointment and certain other matters as specified in Article 320 in respect of the Civil Services and posts. The Public Service Commission has to perform the duties relating to matters specified in that Article. These include conducting examinations for appointment to Civil Services and posts under the State Government and advising the State Government on all matters relating to methods of recruitment to Civil Services and posts, on the principles to be followed in making appointments to Civil Services and posts and in making promotions and transfers from one service to another, on the suitability of candidates for such appointments, promotions or transfers and on all disciplinary matters affecting a person serving under the State Government in a civil capacity and on certain other matters.

Article 229 and Article 234 also contain provisions in terms of which the Commission is required to be consulted in matters of appointment to certain categories of posts in offices attached to the High Court and to the State Judicial Service respectively. Besides, Acts made for certain statutory bodies contain provisions for consultation with the Commission in matters of appointment to certain categories of posts under such bodies. Article 321 also contains provision in terms of which additional functions may be entrusted to the Commission by an Act made by the State Legislature in respect of the services of the State or any local authority or any corporate body corporate or any public institution. Such an Act has, however, not been made till now.

The Commission is consulted by the State Govt. in making recruitment to a majority of Civil Services and posts. However, some posts under the State Govt. have been kept outside the purview of the Commission by making regulations in terms of the proviso to Article 320(3) of the Constitution. Such regulations are the West Bengal Public Service Commission (Exemption from Consultation) Regulations, 2008.

5. Workload of the Commission :

A statistical account of the main items of work performed by the Commission during the year 2016-2017 is given in the following pages under the caption: **Workload at a Glance.**

During the period under report, the Commission held **847** sittings to interview and select candidates for direct recruitment to various services and posts. Altogether **13121** candidates were called in for interviews. The Commission continued its practice of inviting experts of different disciplines to assist it in the matter of selection of candidates and thus it maintained liaison with various universities, institutions and organizations.

For direct recruitment by competitive examination with or without interview, the Commission held **13 (Thirteen)** different kinds of recruitment examinations. There were altogether **2,15,154** candidates applied, **2,23,152** candidates allowed including 7,998 candidates for five(5) main exams and **1,17,006** candidates appeared for these examinations including 6405 candidates in the **05(five)** Main Examinations. During the year under report, the Commission allotted, **1735** candidates including **345** Scheduled Caste, **54** Scheduled Tribe and **264 (B.C.'A'-140, B.C.'B'-124)** Backward Class candidates and 13 candidates from Persons with Disabilities for appointment to different services and posts on the results of different recruitment examinations.

For direct recruitment through selection by interview (with or without preliminary written test) the Commission advertised **1003** posts of different categories and received altogether 93824 applications. Preliminary written tests were held for 19 categories of posts for the purpose of short-listing of candidates. After selection, during the period under report, the Commission recommended 880 candidates including 190 S.C., 48 S.T., 85 B.C.(A), 60 B.C.(B) and 19 P.H. candidates for appointment to different services and posts. The Commission also recommended another 39 candidates including 5 S.C. candidates, 5 S.T. candidates, 07(B.C.'A'-05, B.C.'B'-02) Backward Class candidates and 00 P.H. candidate for appointment to different services and posts from the reserve lists prepared on earlier selections.

For promotion, the Commission held **120** sittings to discuss the cases with the representatives of the concerned departments of the State Government. Altogether, **1071** vacancies in different services and posts were reported to the Commission for being filled up by promotion. During the period under report, the Commission recommended **1050** officers for promotion after considering cases of 3973 officers and could not make any recommendation against 21 vacancies for various reasons.

In disciplinary matters, during the period under report, the Govt. forwarded **93** cases (**31** fresh and **62** old) to the Commission for advice. **18** cases had been pending with the Commission till the close of the previous year. The Commission was able to tender its advice only in **36** cases, while the remaining **54** cases were sent back to the Govt. asking for necessary papers/particulars and **15** cases were pending till the closing of the year (i.e. **31/03/2017**).

The Commission also tendered advice on framing of recruitment rules for 15 different categories of services and posts and on **03** cases regarding revision of examination rules.

During the year under report, the Commission held Half-Yearly Departmental Examination in May & November, **2016**. each time for **7** different categories of officers serving under the Govt. of West Bengal. The total number of registered candidates for the Departmental Examinations was **4,676**.

Despite the fact that Commission performs its function according to the rules and regulations, the Commission was impleaded as a Respondent in a number of Court cases during the period under report. The cases were defended as per the rules and regulations as well as on the strength of records relating to the case. **103** fresh litigations, **04** in the Hon'ble Supreme Court, **29** in the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta, **69** in the Hon'ble West Bengal Administrative Tribunal and **01** in other Court were filed involving the Commission during the period under report, out of which **69** cases (**03** in the Hon'ble Supreme Court, **20** in the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta, **45** in the Hon'ble West Bengal Administrative Tribunal and **01** in other Court) were contested by the Commission. Besides, **136** cases (including old pending cases), **04** in the Hon'ble Supreme Court, **87** in the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta, **45** in the Hon'ble West Bengal Administrative Tribunal against the Commission are pending. Apart from the aforesaid cases, **39** cases, **09** in the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta, and **30** in the Hon'ble West Bengal Administrative Tribunal were disposed of during the period under report.

Table I intra gives previous and current year's figures on certain items of work.

6. OBSERVATIONS

A. Requirement of consultation with the Commission regarding promotion:

The Commission has noticed that the proviso to article 320(3)(b) is being interpreted by many Departments of the Government that consultation with the Commission is not necessary for making promotion from one post to another where the posts are (i) within the same service and (ii) not belonging to any service (i.e. the posts of West Bengal General Service). The Commission is of the view that such interpretation would not be in consonance with the spirit of the Constitution. The Patna High Court in the case of Hariprasad Vs. State(AIR 1972, Patna-4) and the Supreme Court in the case of Jammu and Kashmir Vs. Rajadulari Rajdan and others(AIR-1979-SC-586 and 587) gave the judgement in favour of consultation with the Commission in all cases of promotions. It is mentioned in this connection that the Union Public Service Commission after discussion on the point at the National Conference of the Chairmen of the State Public Service Commissions, has sought an amendment to Article 320(3)(b) in its memorandum to the National Commission set up to review the working of the constitution so that the scope of interpreting the existing expression in the Article is obviated and the Commission is consulted in making promotions from one post to another.

The Commission expects that the State Government would consider the matter and take steps so that the Commission is consulted in making promotions from one post to another in all cases.

B. Reporting of vacancies to the Commission for various recruitment examinations:

The Commission has been experiencing difficulties in obtaining estimates of vacancies from the Departments of Government in time. In some cases much delay occurs in reporting vacancies to the Commission despite urgent requests and repeated reminders. Consequently, holding of personality tests after the written examinations in the concerned cases gets deferred and finalization of results of the examination is delayed. Often vacancies are reported long after the completion of personality tests. Such vacancies cannot be accepted for that particular examination and remain to be filled up on the results of the next examination. Needless to mention that an estimate of vacancies is necessary for the Commission to fix up the number of candidates for the personality tests and once the personality test is completed on the basis of the estimated record, further vacancies for the particular examination cannot be accepted.

The Commission feels that it may be possible for the departments of the Government to make a forecast of vacancies to occur in a year due to retirement. Additional vacancies due to resignations and/ or creation of posts can also be accommodated mostly by the time the estimate of vacancies is required for the personality test. Such procedure should be followed in the cases of annual recruitment examinations in view of the difficulties mentioned above.

An annual calendar of vacancies in the posts within the purview of the annual recruitment examinations may be prepared and maintained by the appointing authority so that an estimate of vacancies in the posts for the annual recruitment examinations could be furnished positively by the 31st March of the year of the examinations taking into account the vacancies to be available by the 31st of December of that year.

C. Disciplinary cases—Incomplete reference from Government Departments:

The Commission reiterates its earlier observation that the disciplinary cases are mostly referred to it for advice without furnishing necessary documents and particulars. Such cases are therefore required to be sent back to the departments concerned and thus it is unnecessarily delayed.

D. Extension of Pre-examination Training Facilities:

The Commission in its earlier annual reports tendered advice in favour of the extension of the existing facilities of pre-examination training of SC/ST candidates for various recruitment examinations. It is noticed that a good number of vacancies reported for these categories of candidates remained unfilled for want of suitable candidates, even after sufficiently lowering the general

standard, during the period under report. The Commission suggests that the Government may consider opening training centres in various places in the state, especially in the tribal concentrated districts.

E. Departmental Examinations—Ensuring Appearance of the officers at the Examinations:

It has come to the notice of the Commission that quite a large number of officers whose cases are forwarded to it and who are admitted to these examinations do not appear at the examinations, causing much inconvenience to the Commission as also wastage of time and drainage of money. So, the Commission suggests that the officers applying for the departmental examinations should be instructed by the departments/officers concerned to appear at the examinations without fail.

[Details of all examinations are given in **Appendix I (A)**. Darjeeling was included as an Examination Centre for 4 (four) Preliminary Recruitment Examinations. 2,484 Candidates applied for the Darjeeling centre of whom 1,492 took their examinations.]

Important particulars of the recruitment examinations held during the year 2016-2017 are as follows :-

(i) Lower Grade Assistant Translator(Hindi) Recruitment Examination,2016:Date of Examination- 01.06.2016

The examination was held at the Commission's Examination Halls at Kolkata. Out of the 90 registered candidates only 6 candidates appeared at the examination

(ii) West Bengal Judicial Service (Preliminary) Examination, 2016 : Date of Examination – 05.06.2016 :

The examination was held at 3 venues in Kolkata and 1 venue in Darjeeling. In all 1,297 candidates applied for the examination all of whom were admitted 826 candidates took their examination.

(iii) Junior Engineer(Civil/Mechanical/Electrical) Recruitment Examination,2016:Date of Examination – 19.06.2016 :

The examination was held at 5 centers across West Bengal including Kolkata. Out of the 27,506 registered candidates 19,330 candidates appeared at the examination.

- (iv) West Bengal Audit & Accounts Service (Preliminary) Examination, 2015 [Old Syllabus] :
Date of Examination – 03.07.2016 :

The examination was held at 16 venues in Kolkata & 1 venue in Darjeeling . In all 6244 candidates applied for the examination of whom 2,523 appeared at the examination.

- (v) Samity Accounts and Audit Officer Recruitment (Main) Examination, 2015 : Dates of Examination – 9th July to 15th July.,2016 :

The examination was held at the Commission's Examination Halls in Kolkata. In all 290 candidates qualified on the basis of the Preliminary part of the examination of whom 208 candidates appeared at the same.

- (vi) West Bengal Audit & Accounts Service(Preliminary)Recruitment Examination, 2016 [New Syllabus] : Date of Examination – 24.07.2016 :

The examination was held at 9 venues in Kolkata and 1 venue in Darjeeling. In all 3,577 applied for the examination of whom 1,215 candidates appeared at the examination.

- (vii) West Bengal Judicial Service (Final) Examination, 2016: Dates of Examination – 01.08.2016 to 06.08.2016, 09.08.2016 & 10.08.2016. :

On the basis of the result of preliminary examination, 318 candidates were allowed to take the final examination held at the Examination Halls of P.S.C. of whom 295 candidates appeared..

- (viii) Assistant Engineer (Civil) Recruitment Examination,2015: Date of Examination : 13.08.2016:

The examination was held at 14 venues of Kolkata including the Commission's Examination Halls. In all 5,245 candidates applied for the examination of whom 3,677 candidates took the same.

- (ix) West Bengal Civil Service (Executive) Etc. (Main) Examination, 2016 : Dates of Examination – 18th to 21st August,2016 :

On the basis of the results of preliminary examination, 6,185 candidates were allowed to take the main examination held at 14 venues in Kolkata including the Commissions Examination Halls. Finally 5,009 candidates appeared at the examination.

- (x) West Bengal Audit & Accounts (Main)Examination, 2015 [Old Syllabus] : Dates of Examination – 23rd to 29th September, 2016. :

The examination was held at the Commission's Examination Halls in Kolkata. Out of 600 candidates qualified on the basis of the Preliminary examination held earlier 452 candidates appeared at the examination.

- (xi) West Bengal Audit & Accounts Service(Main)Recruitment Examination, 2016 [New Syllabus] : Dates of Examination – 26th to 28th October,2016 & 3rd and 4th November,2016. :

The examination was held at the Commission's Examination Halls in Kolkata. Out of 605 candidates qualified on the basis of the Preliminary examination held earlier 441 candidates appeared at the examination.

- (xii) West Bengal Civil Service (Executive) Etc. (Preliminary) Examination, 2017 : Date of Examination – 29.01.2017

The examination was held in 19 centres throughout West Bengal including Darjeeling. Number of venues at different centres were as follows :–

Kolkata (North) – 35, Kolkata (South) – 22, Baruipur – 12, Diamond Harbour – 4, Barrackpore – 29, Barasat – 22, Howrah – 10, Burdwan – 18, Asansol – 8, Medinipur – 14, Tamluk – 8, Bankura – 9, Berhampore – 20, Malda – 16, Jalpaiguri – 7, Alipurduar – 5, Cooch Behar – 10, Siliguri – 9, Darjeeling – 5.

In all 1,06,533 candidates applied for the examination all of whom were allowed to appear at the examination. Finally, 81,942 candidates appeared at the examination.

- (xiii) Panchayat Accounts & Audit Officer (Special) Recruitment Examination, 2016 : Dates of Examination – 10th to 12th February, 2017.

The examination was held across 11 venues in Kolkata including the Commission's Examination Halls. Out of 4,662 candidates 1,082 appeared at the examination.

LIMITED DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION

Limited Departmental Examination of eligible employees of the Govt. of West Bengal for promotion to the posts in West Bengal Audit and Accounts Service, 2016 : Dates of Examination – 21.11.2016, 23.11.2016 & 25.11.2016.

The examination was held at the Commission's Examination Hall at Kolkata. 650 candidates applied for the examination of whom were admitted. 394 candidates appeared at the examination.

9. DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATIONS:

During the year under report, Half-yearly Departmental Examination was held in May and November of officers of 7 (seven) different categories serving under the Government of West Bengal. In May, 2016, number of officers registered for the examination was 2,320 of whom 1,199 officers appeared. In November, 2016, the number of registered candidates and appeared candidates were 2,506 and 1,274 respectively. In May and November, 2015, the position was as follows – In May, registered candidates = 2,714 & Present candidates = 1,030. In November, registered candidates = 2,170 & Present candidates = 1,230.

The particulars are given in detail in **Appendix – I (E)**.

10. ADOPTION OF UNFAIRMEANS BY CANDIDATES IN THE EXAMINATIONS CONDUCTED BY THE COMMISSION :

During the year under report, 16 (sixteen) candidates were reported against by the Supervisors of different examination centres for adoption of unfairmeans in various examinations conducted by the Commission. The particulars of the cases showing the nature of offences and the penal measures taken against them are given in **Appendix – VIII**.

DIRECT RECRUITMENT

11. Recruitment after advertisement and interviews:

During the year under report the Commission considered the proposals from Government reporting altogether 1042 posts of various categories for appointment, after advertisement and interviews or for recommendation from the reserve lists. Details are given in Appendix-II (A) & Appendix-II (B) (synopsis) - 230 of the above posts were reserved for members of S.C., 79 for S.T., 110 for B.C.(A), 67 for B.C.(B) and 28 for Persons with Disabilities candidates.

Regarding the 1042 posts, as above, the Commission took action as follows –

- (a) Recommended from its previous reserve lists 39 candidates including 5 S.C., 5 S.T., 5 B.C.(A) & 02 B.C. (B) candidates.
- (b) Advertised the remaining 1003 posts including 225 posts reserved for S.C., 74 for S.T., 105 for B.C. (A) , 65 for B.C. (B) and 28 for Persons with Disabilities candidates.

In response to the advertisements mentioned at (b) above 93824 applications including 24375 from S.C., 1875 from S.T., 10173 from B.C.(A), 12699 from B.C.(B) and 1127 from for Persons with Disabilities candidates were received.

The number of candidates called for interview during the year under report was 4335 including 930 S.C., 236 S.T., 533 B.C. (A), 454 B.C. (B) and 84 for Persons with Disabilities candidates. Out of whom 3646 candidates including 768 S.C., 193 S.T., 478 B.C.(A), 391 B.C.(B). and 71 for Persons with Disabilities candidates appeared at the interviews. The Commission held 433 sittings during the year under report for interviewing the candidates.

Out of 1003 vacancies advertised, the Commission recommended candidates for appointment to 880 vacancies including 478 General candidates [04 S.C., 01 S.T., 03 B.C. (A), & 02 B.C.(B) candidates ranked amongst the General candidates on merit were recommended against unreserved vacancies], 190 for S.C., 48 for S.T., 85 B.C.(A), 60 for B.C.(B) & 19 for for Persons with Disabilities candidates. Due to non-availability of candidates 126 (including 36 S.C., 26 S.T., 20 B.C.(A), 05 B.C.(B) and 09 for Persons with Disabilities) posts could not be recommended. Of these posts 111 teaching posts under Education Department and the remaining 15 posts were non-teaching posts requiring technical and /or professional qualification.

In all, therefore, the Commission could recommend 919 candidates for 82 different categories of posts during the year under report including 195 posts reserved for S.C, 53 for S.T., 90 for B.C.(A), 62 for B.C.(B) & 19 for Persons with Disabilities candidates – of which 39 [22 UR, 5 SC, 5 ST, 5 BC (A) & 2 BC (B)] from its earlier reserve lists and 880 on the basis of advertisements issued by the Commission. During the year under report, Government dealt with the recommendations as follows:

During the year under report 230 vacancies reserved for Scheduled Caste and 74 vacancies reserved for Scheduled Tribe Officers were reported to the Commission for being filled by promotion.

PART VII

Disciplinary Cases 2016-17

During the year under report 93(ninety three) cases were referred to the Commission for advice of which 31(thirty one) cases were referred to the Commission for the first time and 62(sixty two) cases which had been referred to the Commission earlier but returned for want of requisite documents and other particulars related to those cases. 18(eighteen) cases had been pending with the Commission on 31.03.2016. On verification 54(fifty four) cases including some of the old cases were found wanting in relevant documents/particulars and were returned to the Govt. In 6(six) cases the Govt. issued final order without receiving formal recommendation of the Commission and as such, those were treated as irregular cases details of which are shown in Part-VIII-B. 15(fifteen) cases were under examination of the Commission till the close of the year under report. The Commission, in process, could tender advice in 36(thirty six) cases during the year under report details of which are shown in Appendix-V. In 27(twenty seven) cases the Govt. reported acceptance of the recommendation of the Commission. Regarding remaining 9(nine) cases the decision of the Govt. has not been communicated to the Commission till the close of the year under report.

In last year's Annual Report 8(eight) cases were pending with the Govt. for decision to be taken on the advice of the Commission. Subsequently, the Govt. intimated acceptance of the recommendation of the Commission in 3(three) cases but the decision of the Govt. on remaining 5(five) cases has not been intimated till the close of the year under report.

Irregularity in imposing penalty in Disciplinary cases

1. On scrutiny of the final order passed by the Food & Supplies Department imposing the penalty of withholding of 10% (ten per cent) pension of the Charged Officer for 1(one) year under rule 10(1) of the WBS(DCRB) Rules, 1971 in connection with the case of Disciplinary Proceedings against one W.B.F.&S.S. (Retd.) Officer initially referred to the Commission in September, 2012 it was found that the aforesaid final order was made by the Govt. in the Food & Supplies Department unilaterally without having received any formal recommendation of the Commission. The Commission, therefore, treated that imposition of penalty as irregular.

2. In another case the Food & Supplies Department issued final order imposing the penalty [retrospective basis] of withholding of 25% (twenty five per cent) pension of the Charged Officer for 5(five) years under rule 10(1) of the WBS(DCRB) Rules,1971 in connection with the case of Disciplinary Proceedings against one Ex-S.I. of S.C.F.&S. initially referred to the Commission in July,2014 without having received any formal recommendation of the Commission. The Commission, therefore, treated such imposition of penalty as irregular.
3. On scrutiny of the final order passed by the Health & Family Welfare Department imposing the penalty of withholding of 5(five) annual increments without cumulative effect under WBS(C.C.&A.) Rules,1971 in connection with the case of Disciplinary Proceedings against one Assistant Professor, Neurosurgery initially referred to the Commission in May,2015 it was found that the aforesaid final order was made by the Govt. in the Health & Family Welfare Department unilaterally without having received any formal recommendation of the Commission. The Commission, therefore, treated that imposition of penalty as irregular.
4. On scrutiny of the final order passed by the P&AR Department imposing the penalty of withholding of 5(five) annual increments without cumulative effect under WBS(C.C.&A.) Rules,1971 in connection with the case of Disciplinary Proceedings against one WBCS(Executive) Officer initially referred to the Commission in January,2016 it was found that the aforesaid final order was made by the Govt. in the P&AR Department unilaterally without having received any formal recommendation of the Commission. The Commission, therefore, treated that imposition of penalty as irregular.
5. It appears that the Home Department issued final order imposing the penalty [retrospective basis] of withholding of 1(one) annual increment without any effect on future pay and allowances under rule 8(ii) of the WBS(C.C.&A.) Rules,1971 in connection with the case of Disciplinary Proceedings against one Deputy Superintendent of Police initially referred to the Commission in June,2013 without having received any formal recommendation of the Commission. The Commission, therefore, treated that imposition of penalty as irregular.
6. In another case the Home Department issued final order imposing the penalty of withholding of 20% (twenty per cent) pension of the Charged Officer for 3(three) years under WBS(DCRB) Rules,1971 in connection with the case of Disciplinary Proceedings against one Ex-Assistant Administrative Officer, ND & NSD, Kolkata Police, initially referred to the Commission in June,2011 without having received any formal recommendation of the Commission. The Commission, therefore, treated that imposition of penalty as irregular.

PART-VIII

Irregular Appointment:

There was no case where the Government made irregular appointment to any post within the purview of the recruitment examinations conducted by the Commission during the year under report.

PART-IX

Overriding Case

There was no cases where the Government overrode the recommendation of the Commission in regard to the appointment of candidates on the results of the various recruitment examination conducted by the Commission during the year under report.

However, there is a case of overriding in the matter of framing of rules. The rules regulating recruitment to the Engineering Services under the Public Works Department have been modified with approval of the Cabinet bypassing the Commission. In absence of any notification regulating

exemption from consultation with the Commission as mentioned under proviso to Article 320(3) in the matter of rules regulating recruitment to the Engineering Services under the Public Works Department, the amendment notification nos. 28, 29 and 30 dated 25.02.2016 will be treated as overriding the Commission.

Recruitment Rules/Service Rules

The Commission during the year under report also tendered advice on framing of recruitment rules for fifteen (15) different categories of services and posts from seven (7) different departments under the Government of West Bengal. In the previous year, corresponding figures were forty four (44) and fourteen (14) respectively.

During the year under report total 780 (seven hundred and eighty) number of letters were sent to various RTI applicants by the S.P.I.O, P.S.C.W.B under R.T.I Act, 2005 furnishing various information. Amongst all the R.T.I aspirants, 10 (ten) made First Appeals to the Appellate Authority, P.S.C.W.B. The S.P.I.O and the Appellate Authority in the office of the P.S.C.W.B responsibly accomplished the task of dispatching replies to all the information seekers within the time limit as specified under R.T.I Act, 2005. It is worthwhile to mention that only 2(two) R.T.I cases were eventually referred to the West Bengal Information Commission.

The Commission thankfully acknowledges the assistance received from prominent personalities in various fields, including officials of the Government of West Bengal and Government of India.
